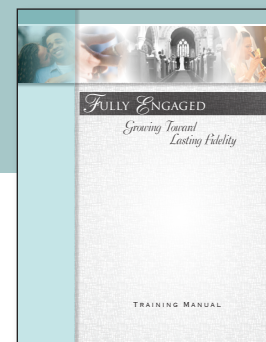


HOW FULLY ENGAGED WORKS



STEP 1

Parish enters details by going to www.getfullyengaged.com, type in the user name and password. Once you access your account click on the "Add/Search/Edit Couples" and select "Add Couple." Type in the couple's wedding date, click the type of inventory they are taking (premarital or Convalidation*), the initials of both the bride and the groom, language, and their email addresses. Click "Submit" at the bottom of the page. Once the information is submitted, the couple will automatically receive a welcome email from Fully Engaged with a link to take the inventory.

STEP 2

Couple takes the inventory. Once both persons have submitted their complete answers, their individualized results are automatically sent to the parish to the email indicated in the parish profile. Couple's Workbooks are mailed to the Engaged Couple from Fully Engaged with instructions to complete Section 1 "Differences" before meeting with their Facilitator(s).

STEP 3

Fully Engaged Trained Facilitator(s) meet with the engaged couple to discuss the results of their inventory. Using the Facilitator Guide, the inventory results and the responses the engaged couple has made individually in their Couple's Workbook, the facilitator(s) lead the discussion and assist the couple with reflecting on the catechetical information presented in the Couple's Workbook. This takes approximately 4 or more meetings.

STEP 4

The engaged couple completes all other diocesan and parish requirements and celebrates the Sacrament of Marriage.

STEP 5

After the wedding, the newly married couple automatically receives an email once a month for the first year, covering topics important to discuss.

* Convalidation: For couple's approaching the Church who are currently civilly married, a completely separate inventory was developed to address their specific lived experience. The Convalidation inventory was designed not only to prepare for the sacrament, but acts as a marriage enrichment tool. Greater emphasis is drawn on the difference between civil and sacramental marriage as well as a more enhanced section on Catholic Parenting. Unique for couples entering the sacrament through Convalidation, a Couple's Workbook as well as Facilitator Guide Pages to match the Convalidation inventory statements accompanies this inventory.
